



“Something My Grandmother Taught Me”

Whether through a saying, a craft, or the example she set by the way she lived, your grandmother made a unique and lasting impression on you. Create a quilt to honor one lesson she taught you. Was it a special recipe or cooking technique? Is she the one who showed you how to sew or to quilt? To garden? To can and preserve produce from the garden? To never waste anything? Whatever lesson you choose, use a combination of traditional and modern quilt-making techniques to represent how the past relates to today in your experience.

Requirements

Challenge Quilts must have

- a title,
- a 4" hanging sleeve attached, and
- a **written** artist statement that explains the techniques you used, the lesson you're representing, and the significance of your choices.
- A common element: a piece of ric rac -- any size, any color, and any amount as long as it is recognizable.

Minimum quilt size: 20"x20"
